

Qualifications for appointment to the post of Principal

1. A Ph.D. degree
2. Professor/Associate Professor with a total service/ experience of at least fifteen years of teaching/research in Universities, Colleges and other institutions of higher education.
3. A minimum of 10 research publications in peer-reviewed or UGC-listed journals.
4. A minimum of 110 Research Score as per Annexure VI-A, Table VI-A.b.
5. The term of appointment of the College Principal shall be five years extendable for another term of five years on the basis of performance

Guidelines for screening of candidates for appointment to the post of Principal in the College as per UGC Regulations and as adopted by the University of Delhi.

Applications received shall be screened as per details given below:

I. Methodology for Calculating Academic/Research Score

Assessment will be based on evidence produced by the teacher such as: copy of publications, project sanction letter, utilization, and completion certificates issued by the University and acknowledgements for patent filing and approval letters, students' Ph.D. award letter, etc.)

The Research score for research papers would be augmented as follows:

Peer-Reviewed or UGC-listed Journals (Impact factor to be determined as per Thomson Reuters list):

- i) Paper in refereed journals without impact factor - 5 Points
- ii) Paper with impact factor less than 1 - 10 Points
- iii) Paper with impact factor between 1 and 2 - 15 Points
- iv) Paper with impact factor between 2 and 5 - 20 Points
- v) Paper with impact factor between 5 and 10 - 25 Points
- vi) Paper with impact factor >10 - 30 Points

- (a) Two authors: 70% of total value of publication for each author.
- (b) More than two authors: 70% of total value of publication for the First/Principal/Corresponding author and 30% of total value of publication for each of the joint authors.

Joint Projects: Principal Investigator and Co-investigator would get 50% each.

Note:

- Paper presented if part of edited book or proceeding then it can be claimed only once.
- For joint supervision of research students, the formula shall be 70% of the total score for Supervisor and Co-supervisor. Supervisor and Co-supervisor, both shall get 7 marks each.
- *For the purpose of calculating research score of the teacher, the combined research score from the categories of 5(b). Policy Document and 6. Invited lectures/Resource Person/Paper presentation shall have an upper capping of thirty percent of the total research score of the teacher concerned.
- The search score shall be from the minimum of three categories out of six categories.

II. Screening of candidates: Criteria and Process

1. The Supreme Council will draw a list of the candidates indicating the points scored by them in descending order i.e. starting from the candidate getting the highest points towards the candidates getting the lower points.
2. For appointment to the post of Principal, there is a requirement of a total research score of One Hundred and Ten (110) as per criteria given under head of Qualifications of this document.
3. In case of any dispute with regard to screening of the applications, the decision of the Supreme Council shall be final.
4. The status of short-listing will be made available on the dashboards of the respective applicants for information.

III. Important Note

1. The Vigilance Clearance Certificate from the parent department/ organization/ institution is to be uploaded by the applicant while applying for the post of Principal.
2. The entire onus of the content/authenticity of the information being uploaded in the form of application and its attachments shall exclusively rest with the applicant in terms of eligibility for recruitment and for subsequent selection through due process.
3. The College shall, in no way, be responsible for any error/ omission/ commission / suppression of relevant information by the applicant knowingly/ unknowingly/

overtly/ covertly while filling up the application form and uploading the documents required therein.

4. In case the applicant gets screened/ selected/ appointed on the basis of the credentials furnished by him/ her which are on scrutiny, found to be incorrect/ inadmissible/ forged/ fabricated/ falsified, his/ her candidature shall be liable to be cancelled at any stage of the recruitment/at any time during the tenure of the service and appropriate legal action under applicable law shall be initiated against the applicant.
5. The College reserves the right to modify/withdraw/cancel any communication made to the applicant. In case of any dispute arising out of such a situation, the decision of the Supreme Council shall be final and binding on the applicant.
